Don't forget to hand in through Seesaw or homework book, on or before **Monday 17th July** so that we can show off our amazing home learning.

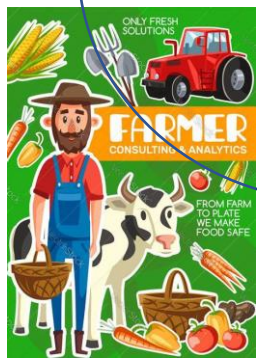


Keep healthy by practicing your athletics! This could be jumping, running or throwing.

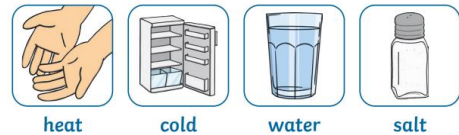

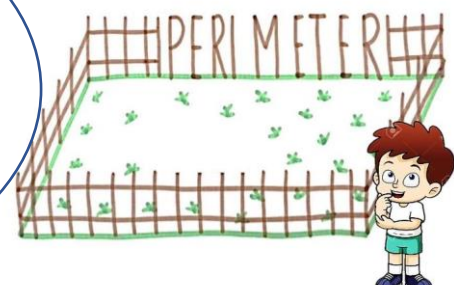


Create your own farm!

Geography

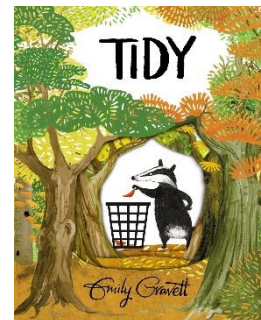
We are learning about farming this half term. The children will explore the differences between farms in the 1990's and modern farms. We will also explore how our increasing population has led to farming changes.

Our Art focus is 3D designs. We will be exploring different materials and how they can create 3D models.

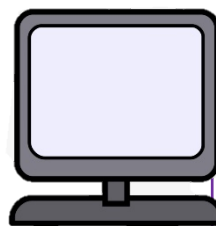
Religious Education
