## Staffing and classroom changes

Mrs Tasker will be leaving on Friday 25th March to go on to pastures new. We would like to thank her for everything she has done for our children over the years at Kettlesing.

We have plans in place to swap the classrooms for Nursery and KS1. This means that all of EYFS (Nursery and Reception) will be together. The Year 1/2 classroom will move to the old nursery where the conservatory is. This will allow teachers to deliver lessons without interruptions from the other class— they currently share this space. It will also allow the curriculum to be developed by the EYFS lead and increase ratios for Nursery pupils entering school. The big move will take place on Wednesday 6th April so it is ready for the Summer Term. Staff will be available on the first day back after the Easter break to support children transitioning here. Y1/2 pupils will enter school through the front entrance. Nursery and Reception children will enter school from the back entrance through the playground.
