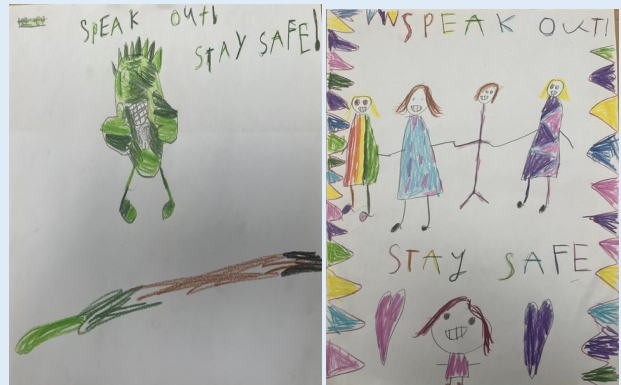


Inter Schools Memorial Football Tournament

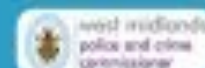



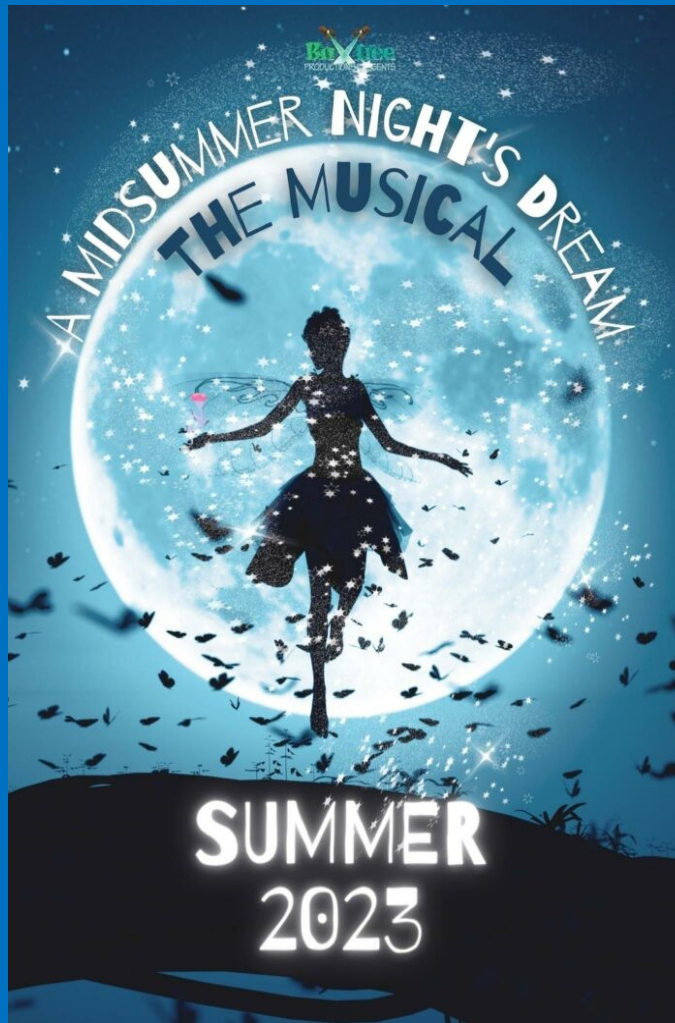
