Dear Parents and Carers,

I am delighted to attach the letter from the recent Ofsted monitoring visit at Beckwithshaw School.

‘Swift and effective action has been taken to make improvements...clear and decisive plans set out ambitious and realistic targets for suture improvement.’

What an immense effort from all stakeholders including you as our well-respected Parents and Carers of the Federation.

As you are aware, in December 2021, Beckwithshaw was judged by Ofsted to be Inadequate and was subject to an Academy Order. Whereas a monitoring visit cannot change the judgement, if positive it can trigger a further monitoring visit and full inspection at which point the judgement is subject to change. Due to the success of the monitoring visit, we now eagerly await a further visit.

‘The atmosphere in the school is purposeful, happy and focused.’

At Beckwithshaw, phonics was a key priority from the previous inspection and I am proud that:

‘Staff follow the school’s chosen approach to teaching phonics with consistency. Staff quickly identify and give extra support to any pupils who may need help to keep up with learning. Resources are matched to pupils’ phonics knowledge well.’

The curriculum was also a priority however we now have a curriculum model that, when implemented with rigour and consistency, ensures children receive educational excellence from the offset. Inspectors recognised that:
